Teacher Representative's Report

Mr. Rutledge gave an update on some activities:

• Phys Ed Dept – C. Appleby is developing a blue print for lifelong career planning and it will start with Grade 10's in PDCP. New intramural programs are now 5 days per week at lunchtime.

Willie O'Ree recently visited school. Terry Fox event was held. Outdoor Pursuits had two successful overnight camping trips. Rick Cotter Classic (varsity basketball tournament) is in two weeks.

- Social Studies Dept. & Science Dept. climate change has been the focus for Fall classes.
 Students participated in talks with Gwynne Dywer, Carl Duivenvoorden and former Vice-President, Al Gore. Had high school voting program during recent federal election. World Issues 120 Class is having a student-led mental health day. A student has met with the Minister of Education twice to discuss school day care for young mothers.
- Police officer presence teachers and students have been concerned about the lack of police presence.

Principal's Report

Mr. Thomas provided an update on recent activities.

- Police Officer position at school Mr. Thomas had previously advised of meetings with Chief Brown and others. Police presence since that time has not been what was expected. A meeting is going to be held tomorrow to discuss concerns. PSSC members expressed concern about this issue and think it is important that Chief Brown is aware of our concerns and the impact on our school, teachers and students. It was agreed a letter would be drafted detailing PSSC concerns.
- Admin team participated in non-violent crisis intervention training.
- Canadian Student Leadership Conference FHS is hosting in 2021. Teachers and students have been taking training to prepare.
- Essential Skills program Mr. Thomas gave details on a new program at the school to develop skills for approx. 6-12 students.
