
MISSION STATEMENT

Morning Arrival

Between arrival times of 7:40am-8:10am, all students will proceed directly onto the playground. Students will be required to have a mask available to them but do not have to wear the mask while on the playground. At 8:10, students will be asked to put their masks on before entering the building.

Once inside the building, students will be directed to their classrooms and upon entering their class, they will be asked to sanitize their hands and at this time, may remove their masks.

Drop-offs by Car

- Students may be dropped off between 7:40am and 8:10 AM.
- Multiple vehicles at a time may drop their child off. Children are to exit the from the passenger side of the vehicle.
- Please do not pass any cars in the line. <u>Patience is required at this time</u>.

<u>Parking</u>

- Parents are being asked to use the designated drop-off lane as much as possible when dropping their child(ren) off at school in the morning to minimize parking congestion.
- After 8:15, should you need to park and walk your child to the building, please drive into the tennis court through the <u>back entrance only</u>. This is a one-way only route. This is for the safety of students exiting school busses.
- Walk your child to the arrival's crosswalk by the student drop-off zone. Your child can then put a mask on and ring the intercom to enter the building and sign-in at the office. Any students entering the building after 8:15 are considered tardy. While parents are not mandated to wear masks outdoors, we do encourage safe mask wearing practices on our school grounds.

Safe Arrival

If your child is going to be absent or arriving late, please phone the school and leave a message stating your child's name, grade, and the reason for the absence.

We kindly ask that you please make all efforts to have your child at school on time for learning. Children thrive academically, socially, and emotionally with consistent routines. If our school can do anything to help, please reach out!

Early Pick-ups for Appointments

- Please let your child's teacher or office know in advance.
- Upon arrival, ring the bell or call the school.
- Your child will be called down to meet you wearing a mask.
- A staff member will walk your child to the front door and note the time of departure.

<u>Dismissal</u>

K - 2 (1:50 pm) & 3 - 5 (3:05 pm)

DUE TO A HIGHER VOLUME OF STUDENTS BEING PICKED UP THIS YEAR, ADHERENCE TO DISMISSAL TIMES IS APPRECIATED TO ALLEVIATE CONGESTION

- Students will be required to wear a mask in the hallway to prepare for dismissal. In efforts to minimize hallway congestion, your child's class will walk out as a group with their teacher.
- Classes will stay in their groups until all students are picked up.
- Parents are asked to wait to receive their child from their homeroom teacher.
- Parents are asked to please minimize gatherings and not congregate before or after dismissal.
- Parents are expected to walk to the balcony to pick up their child.

<u>Masks</u>

Students will be required to wear a mask when they are in indoor common areas such as: washrooms, hallways, school busses, or in the office area.

Sanitizing Hands

Students will be required to sanitize their hands when they enter their classroom (Gymnasium included) at any point in the day. There are additional sanitization stations at various school door entrances if students choose to sanitize in these areas as well.

Handwashing Times

Students are required to wash their hands properly (younger students will be taught this important skill) following snack and recess times. Additional handwashing times have been scheduled into their day.

Distancing in the Hallways & Stairways

Students will be reminded to stay "tight to the right". Teachers will lead students in efforts to minimize congestion.

Teaching Healthy Respiratory Hygiene

Teachers will work on students' understanding of how to wash their hands, sanitize, covering their mouth with tissue or elbow, and wear and protect their mask.

Screening at Home

Please screen your child on a daily basis and only send them to school when they are well and have met the criteria. If your child exhibits 2 or more symptoms of COVID -19, they are required to stay home and schedule a Covid-19 test. Please refer to the guidelines link above for specific symptoms. If testing is required, your child is required stay home until further notice is provided by Public Health. Your child may return to school with 1 or 0 symptoms however if 1 symptom is still present, your child will be asked to wear a mask all day (with exceptions for eating time).

Screening at School (2 Symptoms)

If your child is exhibiting 2 Covid-19 symptoms, the teacher will let the office know and a staff member will bring them down to our designated isolation

room adjacent to the main office while ensuring they are wearing a mask. Parents will be notified immediately and pick-up is required within one hour. You will be reminded to call 811 for potential testing.

SNACK AND LUNCH BREAKS

Please be reminded that our school does not have a cafeteria, so students will be required to bring their lunch from home and eat in their classrooms. Please also note that we do not have microwaves in the classrooms, so we are unable to heat up food. Students are invited to bring their food in a thermos to keep it warm.

Students will not be permitted to share food with classmates, as per COVID-19 guidelines.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAMS

Administration will be communicating Hot Lunch options to families throughout the school year with cashless schools as the method of payment.

ALLERGY ALERT

Food allergies can pose a significant concern and may sometimes be life threatening to staff or students within our school.

Please note that Garden Creek School is a peanut-free <u>AND</u> nut-free school. We ask that parents please respect this policy when preparing snack and lunches.

All families will be required to read, sign, and return our school's **Nut Allergy Form** during the first week of school.

If a student at our school has another food allergy, this policy may be extended to the classroom of that student. Families will be contacted and informed of such an allergy by your child's homeroom teacher. Again, we ask that parents please respect any food allergy policies.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITY TIME

Every effort is made to ensure that students are playing outside during school hours. This will become more of a focus due to COVID-19. Classes will be encouraged to take advantage of outdoor learning opportunities.

Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for all weather conditions. Unless the temperature is below minus 20, students will be going outside. They will need a coat, snow pants, hat, warm mittens, and boots. An extra pair of mittens and socks in your child's backpack often comes in handy on wet days.

CASHLESS SCHOOLS ONLINE PAYMENT SYSTEM

There will be occasions throughout the school year where your family may be making payments to the school. We have fully implemented our **Cashless Schools** online payment system. The expectation is that families will become familiar with the system and comfortable using this method of payment. If using **Cashless Schools** is not possible, please contact the office to arrange alternate payment methods.

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Appendix

Additional Safety Parameters in K-8 Schools

- In the event of an outbreak, mask use expectations may be intensified
- No classroom bubbles for K-8 (Playground zones no longer needed, mixing of classes in P.E may occur, school clubs may occur, flexible work groups may occur)
- Expectation to help 'limit student interactions and facilitate contact tracing'
- Assemblies will not be permitted including concerts and other gatherings
- Visitors will be limited in schools, by appointment only and will wear masks inside the school. (Meet the teacher night is to be conducted virtually). Visitor logs are to continue.
- If groupings of students from different classes are created for learning, the schools will keep a log of which students were learning together (clubs)
- Students and school personnel traveling for vacation or to visit a parent (custody arrangement) must meet federal requirements
- Personalized learning plans from home will be developed for vulnerable students
- Fans are not allowed in schools when in presence of others. Humidex of 36 Celsius or more (Env. Canada by 6am), students learn from home.
 Personnel attend school.
- School buses operate at normal capacity. Students expected to have assigned seating. All students/personnel must wear a mask except for driver.
- Confirmed cases may result in an operational day (learn from home) and continued distance learning to allow for contact tracing and testing.
- The outbreak management process is the same as last year (Superintendent receives call followed by S and P following public health office orders). P notifies parent community and personnel. Public Health notifies identified contacts requiring isolation or monitoring.
