- 4 new teachers: Jennifer Jones (7); Matthew Lynch (7); Stephanie Wilson (8); Dick Paul (First Nations Culture)
- Grade 6 Orientation successful, homeroom teachers had more one on one time with classes
- Soccer has started with large rosters to maximize participation
- Cross-country has begun, first meet Sept 19th, open to all students no tryouts
- Production, choir and band auditions underway
- Eric Hanenberg and Kelly Waterhouse join GSMS as new band directors
