HANWELL VETERANS MEMORIAL

June 11, 2022, 10 am to 4 pm (drop in)

Upper Kingsclear Fire Station #2, 2076 Hwy 640, Hanwell

Residents of Hanwell, Kingclear, and Kingsclear First Nation are invited to participate in the process of creating the Hanwell Veterans Memorial. The obelisk will be encircled by a cast bronze band with relief impressions gathered from meaningful mementos and items supplied by the public.



The idea is to create a complex arrangement of relief impressions created from community-supplied medals, mementos and other items that honour, commemorate or recognize veterans and their contributions to the country and community. These items can be personal remembrances, like a ring, a pipe, a small tool, jackknife, service medal...whatever brings the memory of the veteran alive. Veterans may have items of meaning that they will want to include. We are asking that each person bring 2-3 objects at most. The size should be between 1.5" – 3". Fabric items like the ribbons attached to campaign medals, or even a glove would work. Small objects representative of the veteran's profession can also be included. For example, something like a small spruce cone could represent a forester. Part of the idea is to convey that veterans had lives in the community as well as in service. If the object is flat without a raised or embossed surface it won't make a good impression. Papers and photographs do not work. Use your imagination, involve your kids!
