

What if I do not have an NB Teacher's Certificate? Can I still apply to teach or substitute teach?

Applicants who do not have a New Brunswick Teacher's Certificate must become certified in our province prior to being eligible to teach in long-term or contract positions.

Individuals with an Education degree from another province or country must make application for an Interim Certificate through the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, by contacting:

Individuals who do not hold a Bachelor of Education degree can only be considered for regular day to day substitute teaching at a reduced rate of pay with a Local Permit. Only applicants with a minimum of two years of post-secondary education or those students who have completed the Bachelor of Education program and are awaiting their NB Teacher's Certificate are eligible to submit an application for consideration.

Local Permits are valid for the current school year only and must be renewed annually and an evaluation/re-evaluation fee of \$40.00 is required in the form of a money order payable to the Minister of Finance, Province of New Brunswick.

All Local Permits are screened and approved by the Senior Education Officer and applicants will be notified upon approval.
