What is required to graduate?	<p>12 credits with a numerical grade in grades 11 and 12</p>	<p>five more courses at either/any of ENROLLED or CREDIT (from this semester).</p>	

¹ Students who are ENR (enrolled) can move on without penalty. For **example**, if you are in grade 11 and your science or fine arts/ life role (or any grad requirement) is this semester, you do not need to repeat it for graduation purposes.

*Students not in a position to graduate after semester one would likely have had a conversation with their counsellor at the beginning of the semester if they were off-track.

For all grade 11/12 students:

We recommend pursuing no more than three, but if you are in a position to do more, then you may. We are most worried about students’ mental health, ability to access and overwhelming families at this time. Look after yourselves and continue your learning as you are able. In choosing what courses to focus on, please focus on courses that are pre-requisites to your next years’ courses. If you are in grade 12, you are focusing on courses needed for your university programs.

We do not have all the answers from universities at this time, but so far, we are hopeful that students will not be disadvantaged when starting university due to the Covid-19 pandemic. *Grade 12 students are, again, focusing on courses that will enhance their learning and lead to more success in first year post-secondary. Grade 11 are focusing on pre-requisite courses for grade 12 courses—your having one or two or more courses as ENR will not condemn your academic record or suggest lack of work ethic—we know these are unprecedented times and not all students, from home, have equal opportunity at this time.*
