What is the New Brunswick Teen Apprenticeship Program (NBTAP)?

NBTAP is a joint initiative between the Departments of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) and Post-Secondary Education Training and Labor (PETL). It provides unique opportunities for qualified New Brunswick high school students in grades 10 to 12. Students can participate in up to three consecutive skilled trades summer employment opportunities. NBTAP provides real-world experiences with tracked apprenticeable hours used to fulfil certification requirements. Hours earned can be brought forward into a skilled trades career. NBTAP is about developing practical skills in hands-on settings, while each student is mentored by experienced skilled trade professionals in their field. The goal is to establish longterm connections between employers and students. NBTAP provides an exciting and rewarding path to skilled trades careers in New Brunswick.

Students

If you are a high school student in grades 10 through 12, you can work under a qualified mentor in the skilled trades area, all while being paid. This summer placement opportunity begins in July of 2023. Employers throughout the province are opening their doors and want you to learn new skills that will benefit you now and throughout your career. Working in a real-world setting, you will get to perform hands-on training, while earning hours towards apprenticeship upon high school graduation.

Student benefits of the NBAP Program

As an NBTAP Student, you will be:

- Paid to learn from professionals in the field, learning new hands-on skills in a trade
- Given an opportunity to begin earning apprenticeable hours towards a future career
- Provided with a certified journeyperson mentor in a real-world setting
- Experiencing a career, while researching potential employers to help determine your path

Apprenticeship is an industry-driven, high-quality career pathway where students and employers can develop and prepare the future skilled trade workforce, and individuals can obtain paid work experiences, classroom instruction, mentorship, and a portable credential.

COOP PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS

Coop 120 and Career Exploration 110 are great options for students wishing to have an experiential learning course. These courses allow students to participate in career connected learning and experience workplace learning in fields relevant to their academic and personal goals. Students should connect with their school to see when these courses are offered.

Students interested in participating in Coop 120 have the option to enroll in one of the enhanced coop programs that is being offered – Long-Term Care Coop or Early Childhood Education Coop. These programs both offer professional certification and are a great option for students who are planning to join the workforce immediately after graduation or for students who are planning to pursue post-secondary education in the healthcare or education sectors.

The Long-Term Care Coop Program that allows students to complete a coop placement in a long-term care facility while also completing an online course to earn the Resident Assistant certification. Students receive credit for the online Resident Assistant program via the Health Services 110 course. Students spend several mornings a week in their online course learning the skills required to be a Resident Assistant and the following mornings students work in a Long-Term Care home under the supervision of medical professionals to put their knowledge into practice by completing tasks and practicing skills related to their learning. Long-Term Care Coop is available in any anglophone high school in New Brunswick that offers Coop 120. Long-Term Care Coop is available both fall and winter term; the program is only available in the mornings.

The Early Childhood Education Coop program allows students to complete a coop placement in a licensed Early Childhood Education center while completing an online course to earn the Early Childhood Certificate. Students receive credit for the Early Childhood Certificate via the Early Childhood Services 120 course. Students spend one to two coop periods a week working on their online course learning the skills required to work in an Early Childhood Education facility and the other coop periods are spent at an Early Childhood Education facility working under the supervision of trained ECE staff to put their knowledge into practice by completing tasks and practicing skills related to their learning. Early Childhood Education Coop is available in any anglophone high school in New Brunswick that offers Coop 120. Early Childhood Education Coop is available fall and winter term.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE

School visits – The NBTAP Pre-apprenticeship Coordinator will be making visits to the schools throughout the Fall. There will be a chance to talk about the program and to win some great prizes.
