<u>Literacy:</u>

Reading: Reading Comprehension Strategies:

We will be introducing and adding the strategy "Lips the Fish" to our "C.A.F.E" Menu. When we read a word we don't know "in a snap", we get our lips ready and say the first few sounds of the word. We will work on "Visualizing" this month (Predicting Panda). Predicting Panda reminds us to make predictions about what will happen, before, during and after we have read a book. We will also be introducing Chunky Monkey to the CAFÉ board. He reminds us to look for small words, a sound or a word ending in a word we do not know.

Writing:

This month we are continuing to focus on writing personal narratives. These are small moments that are true to us. We are also focusing on staying on topic i.e. writing a seed story (a story about 1 event or 1 part of our day) instead of a watermelon story (a story about our whole day or summer etc). We are making sure our stories have a beginning, middle and an end and we always end with a feeling. This month we will be focusing on organizing our stories to include a beginning, middle and end. To help organize our stories we use "order" words (first, next, then & finally).

Word Work/Sounds:

-introduce diagraphs: ie, ee/ea, or, ir, ur, er, oo
-Review October sounds
-Introduce the "silent e"

<u>Math:</u>

Unit 2: Representing Numbers to 20

Students will understand/explain: →Say the number sequence, 0 to 100, by:

- 1s forward and backward between any two given numbers
 - 2s to 20, forward starting at 0
 - 5s and 10s to 100, forward starting at 0.

 \rightarrow Recognize, at a glance, and name familiar arrangements of 1 to 10 objects or dots.

 \rightarrow Demonstrate an understanding of counting by:

- indicating that the last number said identifies "how many"
- showing that any set has only one count
- using the counting on strategy
- using parts or equal groups to count sets.

 \rightarrow Represent and describe numbers to 20 concretely, pictorially and symbolically.

 \rightarrow Compare sets containing up to 20 elements to solve problems using:

- referents
- one-to-one correspondence

→Estimate quantities to 20 by using referents. →Demonstrate, concretely and pictorially, how a given number can be represented by a variety of equal groups with and without singles. NB: Identify the number up to 20, that is one more two

N8: Identify the number, up to 20, that is one more, two more, one less and two less than a given number.
