Math

Numeracy	<p>This week, we will be reviewing how to show numbers to 20 by making equal groups using materials and <u>pictures</u>. This is a challenging concept for many students. When we use equal groups (the same amount in each group!), we have some "left over". We call these "singles – UNITÉ". For example: to show 17 using equal groups, we might show 5 groups of 3 and have 2 "unité/left over". We say: 17 is 3 groups of 5 with 2 single. Continue using small objects at home (cheerios, buttons, Q-tips, chocolate chips) to practice showing numbers to 20 (and beyond for a challenge!). As always, continue to work at home on number recognition, proper formation of numerals, and counting forward and backwards from various numbers to 30 (we working our way to 50 by next report).</p>
