

This week's homework:

This week in Grade 1 French Immersion we will continue reviewing our french alphabet and french numbers.

I would like students to practice naming their letters in french. I have posted a PowerPoint file (on my teacher page) where you can practice naming the letter and making the letter's sound. You can then listen to see if you got it right. © This should only take about 5 minutes every night to do.



This year's homework:

Because we understand just how precious family time is and to help meet the Provincial Reading Standards for Grade 1, we are strongly encouraging families to read together every night for approximately 15 minutes as "homework" this year! Even if you are unable to speak French, it is equally as valuable to read in English with your child. The skills learned in one language are transferable to the other. Throughout the year, I will suggest at-home practice and activities for sight words and math. Also at time I will ask you and your child to complete an simple activity and to bring it to school so that we can build upon it during our lessons in French.

Please take the time to sit down with your child and read nightly. Before, during and after reading stories, ask your child questions about what is happening or might happen at the beginning, middle and end. Ask them what they liked best or what their favorite part was and why. Practice finding words on the page that they know. Happy Reading!
