## “Addition for Subtraction” (Fact Families)

The next subtracting math fact strategy that your child has learned is “Addition for Subtraction” or fact families.

### Meet “The Incredibles”



The Incredibles are a family of superheroes (dad, mom, sister, brother). They are all related—just like there are *related* adding and subtracting facts.

## “Addition for Subtraction” (Fact Families)

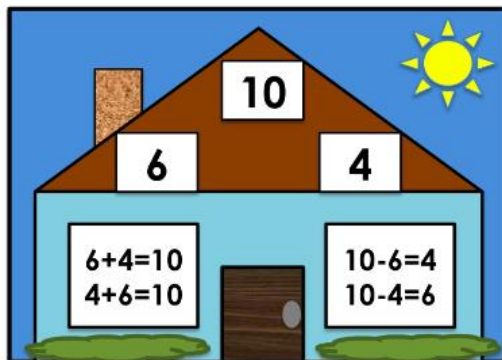
“Addition for Subtraction” is a good strategy to use when you do not know the subtracting answer. Instead... think adding.

When you use “addition for subtraction” you think what is the related addition math fact?



Example:  $10 - 4 = ?$ , think  $4 + ? = 10$ ;  $4 + 6 = 10$  So  $10 - 4 = 6$  The answer is 6.

For every math fact there are 2 addition facts and 2 subtraction facts—the fact family!



So, if I know that  $4 + 6 = 10$ , I know  $6 + 4 = 10$ , and  $10 - 4 = 6$  and  $10 - 6 = 4$
