<u>Dressing for School (contained within the Student Handbook)</u>

- Students are expected to wear appropriate school clothing. This may not necessarily be in keeping with today's fashions; however, everyone is expected to dress sensibly and modestly. The following guidelines should be kept in mind:
 - Tops must have backs and fronts that completely cover undergarments. The chest and waist must be covered.
 - Shorts and skirts are to be of length no shorter than mid-thigh.
 - Pants and trousers are to be worn properly fastened at the waist to ensure that undergarments do not show.
- > Clothing should not bear any offensive slogans, or advertisement of drugs or alcohol.
- With the warmer weather, students often wear sandals and flip-flops to school. Because of that, we see a lot more toe and foot injuries. Sneakers are required for Phys Ed class, and are recommended for noon recess as well.

Student Arrival

With the nice weather – we are starting to have students arriving earlier and earlier. I would ask that families to please not drop off their children until 8am as it is part of our school operational plan. When children arrive early – they have to remain outside (supervision does not start until 8:00am) and there is no means to keep the class bubbles in place while a large group of students wait to go to their classrooms.

Traffic Flow (dropping off in the morning and picking up at the end of the day)

- It has been brought to my attention that some cars are using the church parking area and using it as a drive through to turn left onto Main Street. Please note that the Church parking area is private and we the school extended families should not be using this as an alternate route.
- I would also remind our families that the main parking lot is not a stop and roll pick up, you must park your vehicle when picking up and dropping off their children.
- In the stop drop and roll lane we have many parents dropping their child off on the outside lane, then the child needs to walk across the traffic to get to the sidewalk, which puts this child at risk of being hit by a moving car.

K-5 School Supply Packages for 2021-2022

- For the upcoming 2021-2022 school year we will be offering our families the opportunity to purchase your child's school supplies. This is not mandatory, if you prefer to purchase your child's school supplies, we will be sending home a list of school supplies for each grade level in your child's end of year June report card envelope.
- > We will also post the school supplies list on our school website and on our Townsview Home & School Facebook Page.
- > The cost of the K-5 school supply pack will be \$52.50 (\$50.00 + 4% ASDW convenience fee)
- You can pay for your child's school supply pack by paying through School CashOnline (this is our preferred method of payment). You can also pay in cash or you can pay by cheque. Please make cheques payable to Townsview School, please make sure you identify on the cheque which child you are paying for, or if you are paying in cash, please include a note as to which child you are paying for, so that we can get the receipt to you.

Grades 6-8 School Supplies Information for 2021-2022

- If you have a child in grades 6-8, you will be provided a school supply list in your child's end of year report card envelope. Parents/Guardians will be required to purchase their child's school supplies.
- > Townsview School will not be offering the option to purchase the school packs at the middle school level.
- In addition to purchasing your child's school supplies, your child will also have a \$30.00 student fee to pay (only for grades 6-8). These fees are collected at the start of each school year to support both extracurricular and instructional activities that take place both inside and outside the classroom.
- Your child will also be provided with a student agenda, and a lock for their locker.
- > Students will not be permitted to bring a lock from home and will be required to use only the school lock that is provided to them. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school. Thank you.

Pre-Kindergarten Welcome to Townsivew (2021-2022)

- With keeping our COVID 19 School Operational Plan in place we are wanting to invite you and your child to an Open House on Wednesday, June 16th from 4pm-7pm. We are going to ask that our Pre-K parents call the school and book their tour time slot.
- The tour will involve walking around the Kindergarten wing, the elementary gym, cafeteria, elementary music room and library. It is important that you book your time slot of 4pm, 5pm & 6pm as we need to adhere to COVID 19 PH & WorkSafe NB safety regulations.
- > Each child will be permitted to have one adult with them during the tour.
- In addition to the open house we are preparing an information package that you will be able to pick up that night following your tour to take home with you.
- On the night of the Open House, if you as a parent would like to pay for your child's school supply pack, you can do that as well. The cost of the school supply pack is \$52.50. You can pay by cash or pay by cheque, please make cheques payable to Townsview School. You will not be able to purchase your child's school supply by School Cash Online, as the students will not be registered into our student base until August, 2021.
- Please note, that purchasing the school supply is not mandatory, you are more than welcome to purchase your child's school supplies for next year. On that night of the Open House we will have paper copies of the school supplies needed for next year.
- As we grow closer to June 16th Open House you will be receiving additional information regarding class placement, 1st day of school, etc. This information will come in the form of an email and/or paper copy mailed home to you.

Report Cards Going Home at the End of the Year (June 25, 2021)

- ➤ June 25th is the last day of school for students. With this, report cards will not be available to be distributed to your child any earlier than June 25th. When the students leave for home at the end of the day, the report cards will be given to the students. If your child is not coming that day, you would have up to Wednesday, June 30th to come to the school and pick up your child's report card.
- > If you are not able to come to the school during this time, then we will mail your child's report card home to you.

Special Olympics Western Valley Community Youth Program

Active Start—Special Olympics New Brunswick

(Ages 2-6)

- · Provides active participation for fun
- Athletes develop play skills through movement and daily physical activity
- Skills walking, swimming, running, jumping, balancing
- At the end of this stage, the goal is for the participant to have the physical skills and fitness level to allow physical activity for 60 minutes on a daily basis

- At this end of this stage, the goal is for the participant to have improved in one or more of the following areas: physical skill acquisition, physical fitness, social skill development, decision making, and knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of physical activity
