



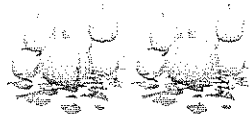

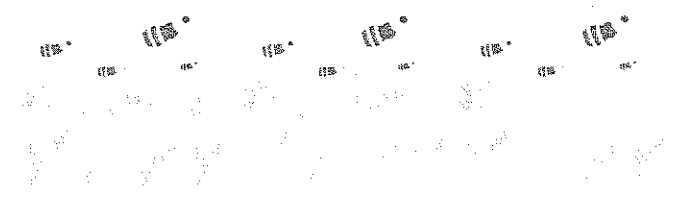

EMERGENCY EVACUATION/SAFETY:

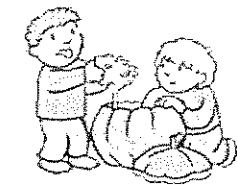

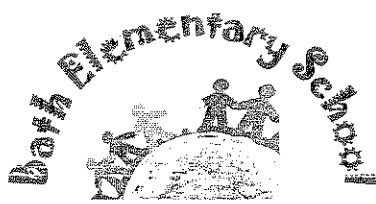

WASH YOUR HANDS! ...stop the spread of germs!

Hand washing is easy to learn, cheap and very effective at stopping the spread of disease-causing germs! Wash your hands: before **meals**, before **feeding children** (including breastfeeding), before and after preparing **food**, after using the **toilet**, after changing **diapers** or helping a child use the toilet, after playing with shared **toys**, after blowing your **nose, coughing or sneezing**, before and after visiting with people who are **sick**, and after handling **animals** or their food or waste.

Hand washing tips:

1. Remove all rings and wet your hands with warm running water.
2. Put a small amount of liquid soap in the palm of one hand. Rub your hands together for 20 seconds so you produce lather. Make sure you scrub between your fingers, under your fingernails and the backs of your hands.
3. Rinse your hands well with clean running water for at least 10 seconds.

4. Dry your hands with a single use paper towel. If you are using a hand towel, be sure to change it daily. During flu or cold season, you may want to give each family member his or her own hand towel.

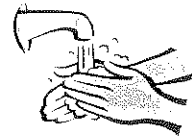
5. Turn off the tap or faucet with the paper towel to avoid touching the same surface that you touched with your dirty hands.

6. Use hand lotion to put moisture back into your skin to prevent dryness and cracking.

7. Model good hand washing technique to your children. Have them sing a song like Happy Birthday while washing their hands to teach them the amount of time that it takes to clean their hands properly.

**REGISTRATION FOR KINDERGARTEN
FOR THE 2015-2016 SCHOOL YEAR**

WHEN AND WHERE TO REGISTER

Registration of children who will enter Kindergarten in September 2015 will be conducted **from October 14-17, 2014, at Bath Elementary from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** There is **one evening registration on Thursday, October 16th from 5:00 p.m. till 6:30 p.m.** This enrollment enables the school district to prepare adequately for the fall term and offer readiness activities for both the parents and child throughout the year. Students should be registered at their zone school.

STUDENTS ENTERING KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten attendance is compulsory for all children who reach the age of five years on or before September 1, 2015. Children who reach the age of five years between September 2nd and December 31st, 2015, inclusive, are eligible to begin Kindergarten in September 2015, but attendance is not compulsory. Parents of these children may defer the entry into Kindergarten of these children until September 2016.

REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION

Parents **MUST PRESENT** the following required information at their zone school to enroll a child for the 2015-2016 school year:

- **Proof of age** (Birth Certificate; Passport; or Immigration Papers)
- The child's **Medicare Number**
- **Proof of Immunization** is required by the Health Act and Education Act for all students entering school for the first time in NB. Please provide an Immunization Card or letter from the Doctor. Information about the routine childhood immunization schedule in NB can be found on the Government of NB, Department of Health website at: http://www.gnb.ca/0053/public_health/immunization-e.asp. If you have any questions or concerns about the required immunizations for school entry, please call Public Health in Fredericton at 453-8252.
