The answer is a multiple of 3.

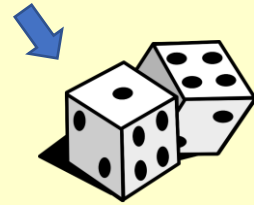
**Clue #3**  
You can see 3 digits represented by the visible faces of the die. None of those digits is in the answer.

**Clue #4**  
The answer is between 35 and 85.

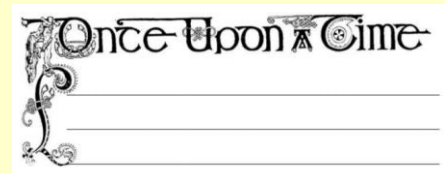
**Clue #5**  
Did you know that the opposite sides of a die add up to 7? For example, the opposite side of the 4 is a 3. Think about the digit that is represented by the bottom of the die. That digit is NOT in the answer.

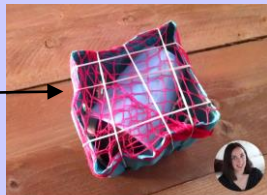
