Kindergarten

Literacy:

- -We will continue to introduce letters and their corresponding sounds using the Jolly Phonics program.
- -We will continue to practice using the reading strategies "**Eagle Eye**" (Look at the picture) and "**Lips the Fish**" (Look at the word and say the first sound).
- -Some basic sight words will be introduced.
- -We will continue to work on "Read to Self" and "Listen to Reading" will be introduced.

Numeracy:

We have begun exploring numbers 1 to 5. We will focus on comparing 2 sets of objects to determine which has **more** or **fewer**, and creating and counting sets of 1-5 objects.

You and our World:

Students will be learning about healthy lifestyles.

Grade One

Literacy:

- -In Daily 5 we will be working in our strategy groups as well as reviewing our reading strategies as a class.
- In Writing Workshop, we will continue to explore writing small moment stories and will be moving onto our next unit, Writing For Readers.

Math:

- Recognizing at a glance, and name familiar arrangements of objects or dots up to 10.
- Represents and counts numbers up to 20.
- Vocabulary words: estimate, equal groups, more, fewer, same as, as many as.

You and Your World:

- Remembrance Day, Germs, Clusters

Grade Two

Literacy:

- Daily Five and Café Concepts / Vocabulary: comprehension, fluency, expression, strategies.
- Writing Concepts / vocabulary: punctuation, spacing, details.

Numeracy:

- Continue working on numbers to 100
- Concepts/Vocabulary: number line, odd and even, counting money (coins), ordinal numbers, estimating, place value (tens and ones), equal and unequal, comparing numbers.

You and Your World:

- Animals: Growth and Change, Remembrance Day, WITS, Clusters.
