

Phonics Spelling Patterns / "Chunks" already covered in class

Heidi Songs cues in brackets

Digraphs - **sh, ch, th, wh** (sh - Hold finger to lips saying "sh", ch - bend arms at sides and move like a train saying "ch ch", th - put hands on head like antlers saying "th th")

ing (king)

oo (monkey)

ou/ow (howling like a dog)

er/ir/ur (tiger)

oa (hold tummy like a tummy ache)

ew (monster picking it's nose)

ai/ay (cheerleader)

ar (pirate)

au/aw (crow)

ea/ee (sliding down a slide saying "eeee")

oi/oy (pig)

or (dinosaur)

Bossy e (e at the end of a word makes the other vowel say it's name - like the e at the end of 'name' makes a say "a")

Magic Y (when a word containing 2 syllables or more has a Y at the end it says "e")

2 Vowels Walking rule (when you see 2 vowels together in a word the first one says it's name and the second one is silent)
