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After School Pickup — If you are picking your child up instead of them taking the bus, you must let the office know. K-5 students can send a note to teacher or call office. If no note or phone call have been received, students will be put on the bus. Grade 6-12 students will be responsible for knowing if they are getting picked up. Please Note: students being picked up will NOT be released from the school until AFTER buses have left the parking lot for safety reasons.



C-NCS School Schedule – Kindergarten to grade 5 classes begin every day at 8:20 am.

Middle Level and High School classes begin at 8:25 am. All students load buses at 2:50 pm Monday – Thursday. Kindergarten to grade 8 students are done school at noon every Friday.

High School students are done at 2:50 pm every Friday **EXCEPT** for the <u>fourth Friday of the month when they will be finished at 12:00 pm.</u>

Supervision for students will begin at 8:00 am. **K-2 students have breakfast and learning centres from 8:00-8:15 and then classes begin at 8:20.**

Students must not be dropped off at school prior to 8:00 am. Students must be picked up promptly after school (2:50pm) if they are not going home on the bus. If for any reason students must leave school during the school day (with the exception of 9-12 students at lunch), a parent or legal guardian must contact the office to sign the student out. You do not need to physically sign the student out but office MUST be made aware of ALL STUDENTS K-12 who are leaving early.

TOY POLICY – Elementary – The school discourages Elementary students from bringing unnecessary toys and expensive items to school. Elementary students are NOT permitted to bring electronic devices such as gaming systems, iPods, cell phones, etc. to school. Staff will not take responsibility should items brought to school become lost, stolen, damaged or traded with another student.



Visitor Policy – We no longer have any Covid restrictions at the school, but this is always subject to change.

Please note that visitors (anyone who is not a student or staff member) are not permitted to travel through the school during the school day. Students can become easily distracted by someone going by their classroom. This policy is also in place for safety reasons. We MUST know who is in our building at all times. This includes when you are picking up your child. The office will contact your child's classroom and ask them to come to the office. **ALL VISITORS MUST SIGN IN AT THE OFFICE.**

Student Fees – Student Fees are due on the first day of school. We know that this may not always be possible. Please contact the school if you need to make arrangements for paying your child's student fees.

Online payments for student fees are the preferred method of payment. This way your child does not have to bring money to school and the homeroom teachers do not have to handle and track the cash received. http://anglophonewest.schoolcashonline.com/
Elementary student fees are \$45 (this includes cost for school supplies)
Middle Level and High School student fees are \$35.



Students Arriving Late (after 8:25) – Please make sure that if your child is arriving late that they check in with Sandra at the office, so she can update their attendance. This is for <u>ALL STUDENTS</u>, Kindergarten to grade 12.



Students Signing Out or Being Picked up

If you are picking up your child from school, please call the school office once you arrive and your child will be called to the office and we will be send out to you. We need to make sure that students are being picked up by an approved adult.

If your child is leaving school for any reason (planned or unplanned), please make sure that they sign out with Sandra. Students cannot sign themselves out (even grade 12 students) a parent/caregiver must notify the office that the student is leaving. If students leave without signing out, they will be marked as Unexcused.



Nut Free School – We are now a NUT FREE SCHOOL. We have students who have severe allergies to pistachio, cashew, peanut and tree nuts. Please ensure that you do not send anything to school that contains nuts. Exposure to even tiny amounts of these allergens can cause an allergic reaction and even put these students into anaphylactic shock which can be potentially life threatening. Our goal is to make our school a safe place for all our students.


