Update on School Budget and Spending – Our general budget was only 80% spent as of the first of March. We looked to secure additional resources for the school that would improve staff and

student sense belonging and show positive overall growth for the school. The budget should be about 95% spent. Our final total will be provided after all expenses clear district office. 7 new cameras were ordered and installed.

Academics:

Students in Broad Based Technology 9 with Mr. Robins are enjoying 3D printing. Students have been
working with TinkerCad, an online 3D design software, that allows them to access their creativity and
explore the world of 3-dimensional design. Many of the students are thriving with this module. They
have an opportunity to print their designs in the Choice Center when they are finished.

Extracurricular Activities

- The Math Competition Club members participated in the University of Waterloo's math competitions on February 23rd. Sarah Lagarde, our grade 10 mathlete, earned a medal with her great results.
- There are six to eight regular attendees of Art Club, many of whom work on various types of art during the time. Art classes are working on painting, sculpture, and various design projects. Ms. Nickerson hopes to have a display of current student work up before the end of the week.
- Ken Robins has started a welding club. There are 12 regular members on Mondays after school. This is an opportunity for students to explore and develop their skill in welding and fabrication.

Guidance:

Grade 11 meeting Mrs. Albright met with all the grade 11 students and invited a university rep and a college rep to explain both institutions to students in detail. UNB and NBCC came and enlightened the grade 11s. This will get the grade 11s rolling with research for post-secondary, and it was a great reminder that NBCC applications opened up in April for them. Articulation agreements were explained as well.

The **mental health group** met last Monday, and our group of 14 is growing and learning. They are connecting and feeling like they can share safely with each other.

Local Scholarships are being updated and put on the Grade 12 MS Teams site.

Wellness PLC:

We had the March Wellness Afternoon on March 30th. It went very well. Things are getting smoother. Students are still gradually taking over the lead but have a better handle on it. Students are having fun, feeling free to enjoy, and experiencing a better sense of belonging at school. Plans have started for the April session.

Athletics: CNHS is into spring sports at this time.

Badminton We just hosted regionals this past Saturday: 8 out of 10 of our athletes won. They head Polyvalente Roland-Pépin in Campbellton next Saturday for provincials. Trevor Rowsell, our coach, believes there is a good chance for both banners.

Volleyball We have 4 teams: JV Boys and Girls and Varsity Boys and Girls. This is the most we've had in years! JV Girls are 1-1, Varsity Girls 1-1, Varsity Boys 2-0, and JV Boys haven't played yet due to some illnesses. The Varsity Boys were finalists this weekend in Fredericton; they placed second in the St. Thomas Tommies' tournament.
