Monday, April 12, 2021 we are welcoming all students back on a daily basis. Essential Skills - students are reaching their year 1 completion and will be receiving their certificates. 8 students from this semester are well beyond their 25% complete.

There has been positive feedback on supporting our students this year. DEC nominations - election is May 10, 2021. Deadline to get the nomination papers in is April 9, 2021.

New Business:

Attendance Requests - students have been asking to attend daily. We have increased the numbers of students attending daily in semester 2. We are allowing students to attend extra days to get caught up on work.

Return to Full Time - there is mixed emotions from students. Introverted students enjoyed the smaller class sizes. Several students have thrived due to smaller classes. Extroverted students feel quite isolated and withdrawn. Data collected shows 50% love every other day attendance and 50% want to be at school every day. Some are anxious about the crowds in the hall and cafeteria when they all attend. Teachers/Admin are doing their best to prepare students. How will attendance look? There will be three scenarios, those that attend every day, those that will not attend for medical reasons and

- those that choose home schooling. Staff will not be using Teams as students are expected to be in school.
- II. Year End Assessment Will be following exam and recovery week for end of semester 2. Typical the last week of school would be June 7-11 with exams June 14-18. We have decided that final assessments, whether they are tests, projects or presentations, will take place from June 7 until June 14. This leaves 4 full days the next week (June 15-18) for recovery and completion of work. Final marks are due June 21, Graduation day is June 24 and report cards are completed for June 25. So, there will be no formal exam week from June 14-18. This is for several reasons, mainly because students attending every other day, it has been more difficult to complete assignments.
- III. Parent Portal on PowerSchool We have 68 parents currently using the portal. This is a great start but please spread the word for parents to join. Karen Guest has been using the portal and finds it not user friendly. Students can use the portal too through their parents' account.
- IV. PSSC Documents- Question, could the PSSC minutes be put on the website? Yes they can and Karen O'Keefe will do this.
- V. School Work Projects New ventilation system has been put in the school.
 - -Testing on radon evacuation system faulting fans replaced
 - -Heating Upgrade
 - -Major electrical up grade will be down in 1-2 years.
 - -New dust collector system for Shop will be complete this summer
 - -Expansion of Choice Center, hopefully this summer
 - -Renovations to Culinary Tech room in next year or two
 - -Outside spaces potential to create a fun place to be around. Add swings, volleyball courts, and basketball court.
