Nature Paint Brushes/Wands

- Sticks
- Leaves, flowers, glass, other plants
- Rubber bands or ribbon or tape

Attach your plant parts to the stick using a rubber band, ribbon or tape. Then have fun trying out the different brushes to see what types of markings they make with paint. You can also use them as wands for pretend play—maybe you are going to play a flower fairy!



Binoculars and Adventure Map

- Large piece of paper
- Crayons, markers, stickers
- 2 cardboard tubes
- String/yarn/ribbon
- Hot glue or tape







Draw a map—your map could be of your yard, a local park or your house. It could also be modeled after a story such as "Going on a Bear Hunt" (as in the picture shown above).

Binoculars: hot glue the tubes together or wrap masking tape/decorative tape around to secure them. Then have your child decorate with crayons/markers and stickers. Attach a ribbon/string to one end on both tubes. Have fun going on an adventure!

A-Hunting We Will Go
