School Clothing Orders


Thanks to all who purchased school clothing. The order has been placed and we will send home with students when it arrives.

- Remind myself it is never ok to hurt others.
- 2- Take 3 deep breaths or count slowly to 10.
- 3- Use my words to say how I feel and what I wish would happen.
- 4- Ask for help to solve the problem.
- 5- Take time to cool down.

Please continue to talk to your children about these strategies and how they can help them when feeling big emotions.
