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In accordance with the communication sent from our Minister of Education, Dominic Cardy, on April 2, 2020 Home learning opportunities to support literacy and numeracy outcomes will be made available online weekly by Teachers.

Families encouraged to:

- Support their children to complete the options below for an average of one hour per day.
- Read aloud with their children daily; and
- consider daily physical activity and free play as an important part of their child's mental health and skill development.

Subjects	Description of Learning Activities
<b>Literacy</b>	<p>Explore the website: <a href="http://www.mcbrine1fi.weebly.com">www.mcbrine1fi.weebly.com</a></p> <p>Listen to French videos, there are many on the website. Listen to a children's television show in French and ask your child to clap for words or expressions they understand.</p> <p>Speak in French: Ask your child simple questions that they can answer in French, such as how they are feeling and what the weather is like. Encourage your child to phone a friend and have a short conversation.</p>

	<p>Read. Set up a daily reading time. Have your child read in French (and/or in English) Talk to your child about their reading and ask questions. What do you think this book will be about? Do you like the story so far? Why or why not? <p><b>Numeracy</b></p>	<p>Counting. Practice counting to 100 forwards and backwards by 1, to 20 by 2's, to 100 by 5's and 10's (There are videos to help support this on the website)</p> <p>Easter Egg patterns, try a more challenging pattern (The example I have posted is an ABC pattern, get them to try AABCC, or ABCCDD)</p> <p>Mental math card games – see website  try “go fish for 10”, working on friends of 10</p>
<p><b>Other areas of interest/learning experiences</b></p>	<p>Health and Wellness: Keep moving. Children should have at least 60 minutes total of physical activity each day. Make physical activity part of your family routine and try to enjoy nature. Be sure to maintain a safe distance from others.</p> <p>Make Easter art: Create an Easter bunny using things you have around the house. You could also take this activity outside and see what you can make using things from nature.</p> <p>Loose Parts Picture: Get creative and see what you can make!
