<u>Practice Ideas....try one each day:</u> Write your 5 words in alphabetical order; write them out 3 times using a rainbow colour pattern; try and find a rhyming word for each one; use each word in a sentence and read your sentences to a family member; ask a family member to quiz you and see if you can spell them correctly!

<u>Writing</u>: Some of you worked on biographies last week. This week, if you are stuck for a writing idea, write about yourself! When you write your own life story, it's an autobiography.

*Write down 5 subtopics that you want to tell about yourself. Ideas could be....general facts about you (age, where you were born, birthday, etc.); your hobbies; things you are good at; your friends; your family; interesting facts about you.



Activity 1: Number Sense – On your 10x10 grid with numbers 1-100. Colour all multiples of 8 in a single colour, and multiples of 7 a different colour.

Practice these number facts with a family member.

Activity 2: Write 3 word problems using multiplication or division. Then show how you can solve them with a drawing and with a written sentence.

Multiplication Example: Landon made 4 pizzas with his mom. They cut each pizza into 8 pieces. How many pieces of pizza did they have in all?

Division Example: A bag of skittles had 28 pieces of candy. If 4 friends shared the candy equally, how many skittles did each friend get?

Activity 3: Play tic-tac-toe with a family member.

Try to find a winning strategy.

Next try playing tic-tac-toe on a 4x4 grid. First play where the **first person to get 3 in a row wins the game**. Can you find the strategy where the first to play is always the winner?

Next, using the 4x4 grid, find a strategy for playing where **the first person to get 4-in-a-row loses** the game.

Activity 4: Estimation and Budgeting

Use a sale flyer from the grocery store (or the store website) to estimate the total needed to purchase

*Write your subtopics as heading on your paper and write a group of sentences to go with each one. By the way, you are practicing paragraphing! Paragraphs are just groups of sentences on the same topic.

*Arrange your paragraphs in an order that you like to tell about you. Remember an autobiography is just a writing piece that tells true information about a special person.... You!

*Add illustrations to your autobiography.

*Choose someone to read your autobiography to and share your illustrations.

Have fun! I'm looking forward to reading your interviews!!

If you would rather work on a different kind of writing like a letter or creative story, go ahead! The important thing is that you write every day. You can choose what you would like to write. I look forward to hearing some of your stories or letters or autobiographies!

Did You Know?







THE CHALLENGE:



Did you know you could grow a garden without soil? This is called hydroponics. Growing plants hydroponically helps gardeners and farmers grow more food faster, in any season, and in smaller places, like your home.

Your challenge is to germinate seeds using paper towel, water, and a baggie. (Examples seeds: Tomato, pepper, squash, chia, bean, lentil)

If one bee helps pollinate 10 plants or flowers in one minute, how many plants or flowers could the bee possibly help reproduce in one hour?


Use repeated addition to help you or build on a known multiplication fact.
