## Spring is on the way!!

**Progress Reports** will go home next week. This third quarter report card is the same in format as what you received in November and represents your child's progress since the last Achievement Report Card. Although on achievement reports, each teacher reports **Learning Habits** specific to their course, on progress reports, these ratings appear only once. At FMS, the team of teachers who work with your children collaborated to select the ratings that best described your child's learning behaviours to date; these will not be representative of every course, but rather give a global view across your child's classes. **Information Bulletin #3** will be included in the report card envelope and can also be accessed on the Report Card Pilot link on the ASD-W web site.

At FMS, we use the **Exploratory Rotations** to deliver Music, Technology, Health, Personal Development and Art curricula as units for one third of the year. We just very recently started the third rotation and it is premature to be indicating progress in these courses, some of which will only have met twice before the progress report goes home. Therefore, you will be seeing 'NA' as grades in those course strands.

Please **sign** the report card envelope and return it to the homeroom teacher to indicate that you have received the report card.

Teachers can support the goal by integrating concepts into their lesson plans. The Home Program on the "Talk With Our Kids About Money Day" website provides parents and guardians with ideas, activities, tools, resources, etc. to help them engage their kids in talks and activities about money on the "Talk Day" or any day! The support resources are organized by age range – e.g. ages 5-7, ages 8-10, etc. There are ideas for activities in the community, day trips that could be taken, games, activities, music, TV shows and movies to watch. The ideas, activities, etc. aim to make the suggested "talks" and interactions comfortable and a good fit with the parent/child relationship. There is no cost.
