## We are in the home stretch!

There are people who would like to describe this time of year as 'winding down' in schools. It won't feel like that over the next three and a half weeks since we have lots going on, including lots of new learning! You'll see there are many events and a few off-site learning opportunities. Despite these, we are full steam ahead with our regular timetable on most days and with the expectation that students are living by the FALCONS code and abiding by the routines and procedures that help our school run well. We thank you for your ongoing support by encouraging students to be all that they can be.

At this time of year, many of our Phys Ed outcomes and activities are best suited to outdoors. For this reason, students should be prepared with appropriate wear for both indoors and outdoors physical activities. Flip flops and sandals are not acceptable footwear for Phys Ed whether indoors or outdoors. All students are expected to be participating in Phys Ed class, just as they are expected to participate in all classes. There are sometimes exceptions which are supported with evidence from a medical doctor which means some of the activities may need to be adapted to accommodate the injury or condition; however, generally speaking, if your child is well enough to be at school, they are well enough to be participating in Phys Ed.

We encourage students to have a refillable bottle of water daily and sunscreen is something to keep in their book bag or locker. Spray sunscreens must be applied outdoors only and we appreciate your efforts to purchase unscented or reduced-scent sunscreens to meet the expectations of our Scent free policy.

The Student Fee for 2016-2017 will remain at $\$ 55.00$. Current Grade 6 and 7 students can pay the fee for next year anytime from now to June 23; it can be dropped off at the office. It works best for us to have the fee in advance to improve our buying power during June and August when most school supplies are on sale. Receipts will be issued when payment is made.

All Hilroy scribblers, binders, duotangs, and paper needed for all subjects are provided. Pens, pencils, erasers, a lock (rental), and planner are also provided to each student. Class sets of scissors, rulers, glue, coloured pencils, markers, highlighters, and calculators are available for students to use in classrooms as well as facial tissues, band aids and disinfectant wipes. This fee also includes schoolwide performances (drama, music, and inspirational presentations), a paid DJ for dances, one trifold presentation board and one or two sheets of bristol board for projects, and many of the consumables for exploratory subjects. The fee helps defray costs associated with our school-wide presentation days (Heritage Fair, Probability Fair and Science Fair) as well as beginning and end of year celebrations.

Parents are asked to supply a book bag, a lunch container and clean sneakers for Phys Ed classes.

The Grade 8 Farewell Party is an event at which many like to take photos. We would remind you of our photo policy which is aligned with Provincial policy and outlined in our Student/Parent handbook: all photos taken at school or school events including sporting events and extra-curricular activities are not to be shared on the Internet or Social Media apps (including Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat and others) without the express permission of the parent of each child in the photo. Please contact all parents of students in your photos before posting or sharing them.
