Report Cards and Parent-Teacher Interviews

Feedback from stakeholders including parents has resulted in several changes in the new report card. Here are a few things to note in anticipation of the first report card coming home on November 19^{th:}

- There will be three reporting periods: November (Report 1), March (Report 2), and June (Report 3).
- All report cards will be Provincial Achievement Reports; there will be no Provincial Progress Reports.
 - The **achievement scale** will include + levels for the 3 and 4 categories as follows:
 - 4 Excelling with the Learning Goals (4+ indicates Outstanding Achievement)
 - 3 Meeting Learning Goals (3+ indicates Consistently Proficient Achievement)
 - 2 Approaching Learning Goals
 - 1 Working Below Learning Goals
- Achievement and attendance data from Report 1 will show on Reports 2 and 3; similarly, data from Report 2 will show on Report 3. Comments will not be carried forward.
- A parent/student comment sheet, to be signed and returned after the first and second reports, will replace a printed envelope.
- The Learning Habits scale will change to describe how often a student demonstrates each habit.
- The Learning Habits will be expanded to include **Initiative**, and the descriptors of each have been revised. In grades 6 8, these will be reported separately in each subject area.

FMS teachers will host Parent-Teacher interviews from 5:00 to 8:00 pm on **Thursday, November 19th** and from 8:30 to 11:30 am on **Friday, November 20th**. You may call Kathy in the main office (392-5115) to book appointments with those teachers you wish to see starting **Monday, November 16th**. Appointments are scheduled at 15 minute intervals. For parents for whom these dates and times are not convenient, please contact the teacher by phone or by email to arrange another mutually convenient time.

School Closures

Anglophone West School District is committed to the safe and efficient transportation of students. The District recognizes it may be necessary to cancel bus runs, close schools, or delay school opening to ensure students are not endangered by hazards brought on by poor weather and road conditions.

Options Considered

- Schools open as usual: no communication required.
- All schools closed for the day: Announcements will be made on local radio stations, through a recorded message that can be heard by dialing the district public information line at 1-888-388-4455 (toll free) any time after 6:00 a.m., and by checking the district website at: www.asd-w.nbed.nb.ca.
- A school or schools in a particular zone of the district closed: We are in <u>Zone 3</u>: Florenceville-Bristol, Bath, Centreville, Hartland, Woodstock
- All school bus routes delayed by one hour: On these occasions, all schools in the district will open at their regular time to receive walking students and drop-off students. Students arriving late will not be penalized.
- Schools may be closed early on days when it is anticipated that weather conditions may deteriorate significantly. It is important that parents have alternate arrangements for their children if they or another adult will not be at home to receive the students. Please ensure that the school has up-to-date contact numbers for parents (work numbers, cell numbers, etc.) and at least one emergency contact number. It will be announced that buses will run their afternoon runs one, two, or three hours earlier than usual, whatever time is determined.

Are Your Children Ready to Learn?

We have noted a common theme among our students: many are coming to school extremely tired and not capable of giving their best to hit learning targets day after day. Adolescents require a minimum of 9 hours sleep per night. However, most are getting only 7. This means that in a week, an adolescent should receive 63 hours of sleep, but most only get 49. The difference of 14 hours (which is almost the same as not sleeping at all for 2 nights a week and then not getting caught up) has real and tangible effects on learning and research is now showing that sleep deprivation causes significant cognitive impairment. Why not chart how much sleep your child is getting and make adjustments accordingly?

We would also encourage you to make time to reflect on pre-sleep routines. Many students tell us that they have their electronic devices in their bedrooms. Did you know that the light emitted from electronic devices signals to the brain that it should be in 'wake up' mode? Why not give some of these strategies a try in your home:

- Set evening routines, including assigned bed times, to help your child create a routine for his/her body
- Have a bin or basket in a common area for all electronic devices to spend the night rather than allowing these in bedrooms
- Turn all tvs and gaming systems off at least 30 minutes before 'lights out'. This allows the brain to stop receiving messages that activate the 'stay awake' message.
- Encourage reading from a book or magazine in those now 'free' 30 minutes before sleep as a way to settle the brain for sleep.
- Reserve sleep overs and late night outings for weekend evenings rather than school nights.

Hopefully, with improved bedtime routines, fewer students will be coming to school exhausted.
