SOME OF THE IMPORTANT ITEMS

- Student Data Sheets were sent home (legal sized paper with pre-filled info). Please verify that all information is accurate and make any corrections that are necessary. Sign where indicated and return ASAP! If at any time changes are made to contact information, it is important that these changes be provided to the school.
- Student/Parent Handbook: This is in the front of student agendas. This is
 a document meant for you to review with your child so that you, and
 they, can get to know the expectations, routines and procedures at
 FMS! There are important pages for you to fill out and sign. Please send
 in ASAP!
- The Student Fee is \$60 which includes all school supplies as described in the Student/Parent Handbook. This fee can be paid online through the School Cash website – you can find the link on our school website!
 Otherwise you can send in a cash or cheque with your child.
- Custody Information: By law, schools are required to provide, on request from non-custodial parents, information about a student's education, except when a court order prohibiting access of a parent to a child exists. If there is a current, valid court order prohibiting access to this child, the responsibility rests with the custodial parent to provide the school with a copy of this document. Please send in a copy or contact Sally for other arrangements.

Remember...

- Students are only allowed to have ONE drop off location this year – changes to busing must have 5 days notice and go through the transportation department.
- -If your child is being picked up, please send a note in their agenda for the teacher. Buzz into the office or call 392-5115 when you arrive, and please wait in your vehicle.
- Students are unable to walk off campus unless they are walking home (live within walking distance).
- Please have an emergency plan in place for if your child is sick at school.

DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP

Many families are dropping students off and picking students up this year. Just a reminder about safe travels! Please make certain that when entering the property, you enter on the "McCain" side of the driveway and exit on the "bridge" side. At no time should visitors drive behind the school during the school day – when you enter, cross in front of the building. If you are picking students up, please pull all the way up to the end of the driveway and fill in behind. Due to the increased number of pickups, we need all the room we can get!

IMMUNIZATIONS

Grade 7 students brought home information pamphlets with consent forms today. Any questions can be directed to Public Health.


COMMUNICATION PROTOCOL

The cafeteria does NOT offer credit. All orders will have to be paid for online using the Chartwells website

(https://cafzone.ca/). Meals will be delivered to student homerooms. Students bringing their lunch need to bring along their own cutlery and condiments.

HOME SCREENING SYMPTOMS

As per provincial expectations, parents are asked to screen their child before sending them to school each morning. The screening questions are:

My child does not have purple markings on their fingers or toes.

My child does not have two of the following symptoms:

- Fever above 38°C or signs of a fever
- A new or worsening chronic cough
- Sore throat
- o Runny nose
- o Headache
- o New onset of fatigue
- New onset of muscle pain
- Diarrhea
- Loss of sense of taste or smell
- o Difficulty breathing

If your child has purple markings or two of the above symptoms please keep them home and call 811 for direction.
