Drop-off and Pick-up of Students

We attempt to minimize interruptions (announcements, visitors etc.) during the instructional day (8:00 - 2:40). Please stop at the office if you need to pick your child up during this time. This helps to ensure continuous learning throughout the day. We ask that anyone dropping off a student after 8:00 come into the office and sign the student in for the day. If you are picking up your child prior to dismissal you need to sign into the office before taking your child out of the school. Also, if you are entering the building to pick up your child at dismissal time you need to first sign in at the office so that we can account for everyone in the building.
