Instructions

If you were able to do this correctly, in 20 minutes or less, you get the cards. If not, the cards go at the bottom of the deck.

- Water filter challenge Separating a Mixture some may have done this in class, but this can be a chance to learn from your mistakes and try and do it better!
- The object is to construct a filter to separate the visible dirt from a glass of muddy water. You will pour the muddy water through the filter into another cup with the goal is to get the water as clean as possible.
