Here is an example of a conclusion:

In recent years there has been increased discussion about homework and whether teachers should expect students to do work at home outside school hours. Homework can be difficult for some students to complete. They might have after school responsibilities such as a job or to look after siblings. If they do not know how to do the work, their parents are not always able to help them. Those in favour of homework say it is an important part of learning because it allows students to practice at home, get work done they did not finish in class and it lets parents know what their children are learning. I believe that homework should not be assigned unless there are extenuating circumstances. Students have enough learning at school, and they need a break once they get home.

Social Studies	<p>Online Resources:</p> <p>Newsela provides students with thousands of texts on topics they care about most. https://newsela.com/</p> <p>Indigenous Studies 120 Continuation of Learning May 25th to May 29th</p> <p>Hi/Qey!</p> <p>This week I would like to provide you with some introductory information on what a Pow Wow is.</p> <p>I will also include a short video clip on two of the Traditional Pow Wow dances.</p> <p>What is a Pow Wow?</p> <p>Pow Wow's are ceremonial celebrations of cultural pride for all ages and provide an opportunity for Indigenous communities to gather, celebrate, commemorate and learn from each other. These dynamic events showcase the music, dance, regalia, food and crafts of Indigenous peoples and nations from across Canada.</p> <p>Locally the first Pow Wow of the season is held at UNB Fredericton's Currie Center. Most Pow Wows take place outside however the one at the Currie Center is inside. Unfortunately, due to the Pandemic, the Pow Wow was not held this year. Throughout the summer months several First Nations communities host Pow Wow's in New Brunswick and across Canada.</p> <p>What is Regalia?</p> <p>Often people refer to the Traditional outfits worn by participants at a Pow Wow as "costumes". Testimony videos from "Pre War Antisemitism" to "Liberation" and fill out the two columns with your notes and reactions.
4. Choose two of the five discussion questions and respond with a paragraph for each one, or discuss with a friend/family member who has also seen Peter's testimony videos:
 - Compare and contrast Peter's telling of the same event. How are the two excerpts similar? How are they different?
 - Peter was an active Holocaust Survivor Outreach Speaker for the Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre. How do you think Peter felt when students asked questions about his experiences during the Holocaust?
 - A personal account is not a history. Yet, many historians regard personal accounts as invaluable. What is the difference between memory and history? What can you learn from a personal account that you cannot learn from a history book?
 - Many Holocaust survivors talk about the importance of telling their story in order to educate subsequent generations. Why does remembering matter?
 - What do you think you will remember about this experience? Why?
