Working for credit - Write an opinion piece that answers the question: "Is a government ban on assault weapons going to help reduce crime in Canada?" Your paragraph should be 2-3 paragraphs and it should convince me that your opinion is the right one. Each paragraph is to be well developed with a general statement and supporting details. For this assignment I am looking whether you can support an opinion with valid details as well as general examples. Make sure that you are citing fact and not just what you think you know.

Here are some guiding questions to help you (but you don't have to answer them – they are just to help you organize your thoughts)

- 1. Do you believe that there is a benefit to banning weapons?
- 2. Will banning these assault style weapons help reduce crime in Canada?
- 3. Should people be required to get of those that they currently own or should such a ban only be for new purchases moving forward?
- 4. Is there a difference between a person who lives in rural Canada owning a weapon such as a gun and someone who lives in the city, such as Toronto or Vancouver?
- 5. Should gun owners be compensated for weapons they have to get rid of under this ban?

Learning Opportunity – if you don't want to complete the written response, have a discussion with someone about the issue of gun control.

Phys. Ed.

It is recommended that you complete 30 minutes of physical activity a day.

This week try to do a different activity every day. This is a sample plan that you can follow or modify if you would like. You can change the order, or substitute activities you prefer, just try to get your 30 minutes of activity in each day.

Monday – Cardio – go for a brisk walk or jog while maintaining social distancing and obeying the laws of the road.

Tuesday – Strength – Do a circuit of crunches, push ups, burpees, planks and squats.

Wednesday – Skills – play catch, shoot some hoops or dribble a soccer ball.

Thursday – Flexibility – Do some yoga or tai chi. Do an online class or practice some of the movements you already know.

Friday – Cardio and agility – Do a circuit of sprints, T-drills, jogging, pogo jumps (back and forth over a line two footed) and shuttle runs (sprinting back and forth, changing direction).

Skilled Trades

Electrical Wiring

Electricity is transmitted to our neighbourhoods through high voltage powerlines. The voltage is stepped down by transformers that are either mounted on power poles or on installed on concrete pads on the ground. Wires running from the transformers to our homes are carrying electricity at 120/240 V which pass through electrical meters that are mounted to the side of the house or the electrical room within apartment buildings.

Take a walk outside and see if you can locate the transformer that feeds your home. If it is pole-mounted, it will look like a grey trashcan. Pad-mounted transformers are usually green boxes that are sometimes surrounded by fencing. For pole mounted transformers, follow the wiring leaving the transformer to identify to which homes it is providing electricity. Next, take a look at your electrical meter. What kind of information can you gather from the meter itself?

Finally, locate an electrical panel in your home (do not remove the cover). What information can you get from it? Is it a fuse box or a breaker panel? If it is labeled, what further information can you get from it? If you like send me the information you gathered or any electrical questions you may have.
