- Steamspace: Steamspace aims to foster creativity and innovation, and to support all types of making. The space is designed to serve the creative needs of faculty, staff, and students whether for academic or personal purposes. It will also be one of the first university makerspaces in North America that welcomes members of the surrounding community. The 2500 ft² space is home to a variety of tools for twenty-first century design, prototyping, and digital creation. It will host course activities such as using 3d printers and laser cutters. - Growcer: The Growcer is an out-of-the-box local food solution located steps away from the dining hall. Acadia partnered with its food service provider Chartwells to bring the hydroponic, vertical growing system housed inside a repurposed shipping container to campus. It will produce greens and microgreens year-round and employ students. It is the first of its kind for post-secondary institutions in Atlantic Canada

- Cape Breton University is continuing to grow, with our current enrolment now at approximately 4,500 students.
- The Fall 2020 semester at Cape Breton will be delivered completely online. The decision to move to online is in the best interest of our campus community's safety.

# **Research and Funding**

- CBU was recently awarded \$1.3 million in funding for a five-year project in national research initiative on affordable housing.
- Faculty member Dr. Xu Zhang awarded prestigious Canada Research Chair in Healthy Environments and Communities.
- Faculty member Dr. Leviten-Ried and her team received a \$1.3 million investment from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) and the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) to lead a national research initiative on the importance of affordable rental housing for those in greatest need.
- Bachelor of Science Nursing students win first place at a National Techstars Startup Conference for their project focusing on improving communications between nurses and family members regarding updates about their loved ones during COVID-19 and thereafter.

# Memorandums of Understanding

• Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey (MK) and CBU signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to increase access to post-secondary education for Mi'kmaw people.  CBU formally signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the 5<sup>th</sup> Canadian Division of the Department of National Defense.

COVID-19 has impacted our day-to-day at the college, but has not prevented up from hosting in person classes! Students are still receiving the hands-on experience that they signed up for, and whenever 6-feet of distancing cannot be maintained staff and students are required to wear a mask or face covering.

Our college is currently undergoing a program review to ensure that we are providing students with the best education possible. The new first year students that started in September 2020 mark a transitional cohort to shift over to the new program delivery. This new program will allow students to obtain a Diploma in Forest Technology or a Diploma in Fish & Wildlife Technology in

two years, and allow graduates to return for a third year to obtain the alternate diploma, allowing students to receive two diplomas in three years if desired.

MCFT has also created and launched a new website, and worked with a local real estate company to have an interactive virtual tour created, which can be accessed using the link to Campus Tours above.

The MFRS/MCFT Alumni Association is in the midst of developing the most extensive entrance scholarship program the college has ever seen. Our accreditation with the North American Wildlife Technology Association (NAWTA) has recently been renewed, and our accreditation with the Society of American Foresters is in the process of being renewed now.



	WHAT'S NEW?

NBCC signed numerous pathway agreements in the past year including, an agreement with Cape Breton University (CBU) that provide graduates of NBCC's Criminal Justice: Corrections, Criminal Justice: Police Foundations, Child and Youth Care Worker, and Early Childhood Education programs the ability to transfer their credits to CBU's three- or four-year Bachelor of Arts Community Studies programs. Humber College and NBCC have also entered into an agreement to facilitate the transfer of NBCC students with advanced standing into Humber's Bachelor of Social Science — Criminal Justice degree. In particular: successful graduates of NBCC's Criminal Justice: Police Foundations program will be able to enter Year 3 of the degree; and successful graduates of NBCC's Criminal Justice: Corrections program will be able to enter Year 2, Semester 4 of the degree. Finally, NBCC and Yorkville University have signed an agreement that provides a new pathway for NBCC's business administration diploma graduates to obtain a degree. Students who complete NBCC's two-year Business Administration program can now be awarded transfer credits and directly enter their third year of a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degree at Yorkville University. For more details, visit Pathway Agreements.

NBCC launched a new two-year **Social Services Community Worker** program. This all-new program will combine skills in social work, behavioural sciences, and humanities to prepare graduates for work with families, groups, and communities. It will incorporate elements of the former Human Services and Child and Youth Care programs and will be designed to enable students to specialize in a specific area of Human Services, such as youth care or elder care. The Child and Youth Care and Human Services programs will no longer be accepting applications. The Social Services Community Worker program will also provide an exit point in the program after the 1st year.

NBCC launched a new **Trades Foundation** program with an intake in January 2021 and September 2021. The program will create a two-year delivery, with students able to explore multiple trades in the first year and then move into a chosen trade in the second year. The move to a two-year program will be attractive to those students who are thinking about a trade but who are also uncertain about which trade would be the best fit.

#### **COVID-19 Protocols**

We are pleased to announce that Elizabeth Tuck from Mount Pearl, Newfoundland has been awarded one of 11 prestigious Rhodes Scholarships for Canadian students. Elizabeth completed an Honours in Human Rights at St. Thomas, submitting a thesis entitled "United States Workplace Harassment Jurisprudence in the era of #MeToo," in addition to majors in Political Science and Great Books.

#### **New Orientation Program**

St. Thomas University has launched a new orientation program to complement our existent Welcome Week programming. While Welcome Week primarily helps students forge relationships within the STU community, STUdent Orientation was designed to help students navigate the transition of starting post-secondary, university-level studies at St. Thomas. It is largely focused on helping students cultivate and refine their study skills, time management strategies, ability to use academic tools and technology, and knowledge of services and resources available to them.

## **New 2SLGBTQQIA+ Campus Wellness Coordinator**

In addition to our existent Mental Health Coordinator, Healthy Campus Coordinator, International Student Coordinator, Student Accessibility Services Coordinator, and Indigenous Student Services Coordinator, St. Thomas University now has a 2SLGBTQQIA+ Campus Wellness Coordinator, Cassidy Wilson. Cassidy provides counselling to students, acts as a resource

for student clubs, provides educational sessions and resources to the campus community, and advises the university on matters of policy and programming related to gender identity and sexual orientation.

# **New Indigenous Experiential Learning Coordinator**

In March, St. Thomas University's Office of Experiential and Community-based Learning welcomed Jessica Paul as our new Indigenous Experiential Learning Coordinator. Jessica helps Indigenous students secure experiential learning opportunities, including paid internships, throughout our community. She also has launched an internship program specifically geared towards helping first and second-year Indigenous students develop transferable skills and connections in the campus and local community; several students are completing internships in the program's inaugural year now.

#### **Investments in Online Learning**

St. Thomas University has made significant investments in online learning, including hiring two staff members: an educational technologist and an online instructional designer. In addition, STUdents now have access to new online learning technology. These tools include Perusall, which helps to keep students engaged in their readings and with one another and their professors, as well as Panopto, which allows for engaging and dynamic recorded lectures. These investments help to ensure the rigor of courses and quality of instruction now and long after the pandemic.

New Program: The bachelor of health program at UNB Saint John is unique in Canada, offering an interdisciplinary curriculum that integrates arts, business and science. UPEI will soon have its fourth residence on campus. The new 260-bed building will bring the capacity of university housing from 9.4 percent of the student body to 15 percent. The infrastructure project is expected to be done by the end of 2022 and complete UPEI's transition to a temporary athletes' village for the 2023 Canada Winter Games. Following the games, the residence will provide year-round housing for post-secondary students.

UPEI's Applied Climate Change program has just announced the addition of a brand new climate change research centre that will be built in St. Peters, PEI. The 45,000 square-foot facility will have research, teaching and learning spaces. There will also be 50 residence rooms, made up of both one- and two-bedroom suites. The \$18.5 million project is being jointly funded by the provincial and federal government.

Students in the Faculty of Sustainable Design Engineering lent a hand to fighting COVID-19 this year by building ventilators. They also worked directly with PEI Public Health to design and produce personal protective equipment that can be sterilized and reused to keep provincial healthcare workers safe.
