Creating a Growth Mindset

Environment in Your Home Part 3:

Redirecting Fixed Mindset Thinking
Redirect your child's fixed mindset statements. If you hear your child say "I can't do math" or "I just can't understand Shakespeare," point out the fixed mindset thinking and direct them to a growth mindset place. Remind your child that they may not understand yet, but will by asking questions, finding new strategies, setting small goals and working hard. Two examples of how to redirect such statements are included below.

IF YOUR CHILD SAYS	THEN YOU MIGHT SAY
"I can't do math"	"You may not understand this yet, so let's practice some more."
"I don't need to study; I always do well on math assessments."	"Studying can help prime the brain for further growth. Maybe you should let your teacher know that these assessments don't require much practice for you and that you are willing to take on more challenge."
