### **Creating a Growth Mindset Environment in Your Home Part 2:**

Using Growth Mindset Praise and Feedback

- Praise what your child does, not who he or she is. Instead of saying, "You are so smart/clever/brilliant," say "I can see you really works hard/put forth effort/tried hard." Praise perseverance and resiliency when you see your child struggle or face a challenge. Avoid praising grades. Focus on praising work ethic and effort – not achievement.
- Adopt the word "YET" into your vocabulary. If your child proclaims that he doesn't understand something, can't dribble a basketball, or can't play a song on his guitar, remind him that he can't "YET" but with hard work he will have success.
- Avoid comparing your child's success with siblings or friends – achievement is not a competition. There is enough success for everyone.
- An important thing for all of us to remember is to not be afraid to ask for help. Some children (and adults) feel if they ask for help it means they are not smart. We want children to not be embarrassed to ask for help because when a child asks for help they learn new things and therefore their brain grows!
