Creating Safer Schools During the month of October, every year schools across the province engage students in safety protocols for fire drills, bus safety/evacuations and secure the building exercises. We rehearse and learn about bus and school evacuations, and although these events can heighten concern, it compares little to the concern of not knowing what to do in the event of a real situation. Our team of teachers and support staff work hard to make students comfortable with practice so we will know how to respond if needed. Bus and Fire safety weeks are noted on the calendar. Safe school practices will take place all month.

<u>Dismissal Support and Safety: We Need Your Help!</u> Over the course of the last two weeks we have been fine tuning our dismissal and drop of routines for your child's safety. An outstanding concern remains STUDENT PICK UP BY VEHICLE at day's when there are between 70-80 vehicles daily. There are some changes in student locations at the end of the day that will be happening this week and students who are being picked up will be dismissed and supervised by staff members while they wait for you. Please understand that we must practice safety above and beyond the need to rush out of the parking area. Please see below:

- Students will wait with their classmates at an assigned spot at the end of the building.
- 2. NOTE: Students being picked up, will now be dismissed at 2:55 to class lines so we can move along more safely and efficiently. They will be waiting for their chauffeurs! Try to be at the school at the following times so this might help with the flow of traffic, it's not much of a margin, but it might help:
 - Gr. 3 drivers be at school for 2:55
 - Gr. 4 drivers be at school for 3:00
 - Gr. 5 drivers be at school for 3:05
- 3. One Lane to Pick Up and One Lane to Exit Drivers are to use one lane only for pick-up, leaving the lane by the grassed circle FREE to pass by, once your child is in the car.
- 4. NEW- We ask that you do not park and wait for your child. We are hoping parents will make one line of traffic in one lane and we can avoid students being in the parking lot at all. About 7 students can be loading into their cars effectively and safely and you do not need to get out.
- 5. IF for some reason you must park, please do not call your child to your car. They cannot cross in front of and through vehicles safely. In this case, come to meet your child where they are located and escort them to the car.
- 6. The first group of parents lined up along the building will have students load and move forward. Once we get into the routine, it will be smoother and much safer!
- 7. Thanks in advance for your patience and cooperation, not only are we trying to protect the bubble but more importantly your child's safety. This school was never designed for the traffic created by COVID 19, so we sure appreciate your help!
