

## I Spy!




The leaves are not out yet, so they have to be tree detectives, looking at the bark or underneath the tree for acorns or pinecones left over from the fall.

Mona had asked her mom to add a robin to today's 'I Spy' chart.





Last week Mona was talking to Grandpa.
