


Texts will include a novel study, short stories, poetry, Shakespearian drama, and non-fiction. Students are required to come prepared with a reading of their choosing for daily silent reading.

Writing that will be practiced this year includes expository, persuasive, memoir, and research. An emphasis will be placed on the use of proper citations of academic sources.

Our biggest goal this year is that all learners will further develop their critial thinking and inquiry skills. Students will have many opportunities to question what they read, see, and hear over the course of grade 11 English.
