

## Financial & Workplace Math 11

Welcome to Mr. Davis' Financial & Workplace Math Class! This course is one semester (Exam in January) and is designed to provide students with mathematical understandings and skills identified for entry into some college programs and for direct entry into the work force. Topics will include (and are listed below) financial mathematics, algebra, geometry, measurement, number, and statistics.

**Outcomes & Chapters**: Below are the curriculum outcomes and topics to be covered in order over the course of the term.

- 1. Statistics S1 chapter 4
- 2. Trigonometry G1 chapter 7
- 3. Geometry G2/3/4 & A3 chapter 2
- 4. Slope A1 & A2 chapter 6
- 5. Finance (Number) N2/3/4 chapter 5
- 6. Outcome N1 Ongoing throughout the term


## Evaluation Breakdown:

**Textbook**: Math at Work 11 - Students will be assigned a textbook; however their textbook is expected to remain in the class. If for some reason a student needs to take a textbook home, they may sign one out and return it when they are finished.





## **Expectations:**

- Have regular daily attendance, and be on time! Students are responsible for catching up
  on any notes, work or assignments that may have been missed due to absence. If a student
  misses a test they are expected to write it the next day they return to school at lunch. If
  the student does not arrive to write the test or make alternate arrangements the student
  will receive a mark of zero.
- 2. Have a good work ethic! Be on time, attentive, respectful, keep an appropriate notebook, ask questions, and be prepared to learn when you enter the classroom.
- 3. Seek extra help when concepts are unclear. I will make time to help clarify information after class.
- 4. Complete all work and assignments! There will be assignments given throughout each unit which students will normally be given time in class to complete; however any unfinished work will have to be completed at home. As well, there will be daily work presented that may or may not be worth marks; however to be successful in the course you should complete all work presented.

**Updates and assignments:** This course and others I teach will be updated periodically on the school website. Please check from time to time for new assignments or upcoming tests. If you are absent for a day or more it is the expectation that you go to the website to see what you have missed.
