Meal Programs

Parents are asked to download the free Nutrislice app or visit Chartwellsk12.ca. Meals must be prepaid and pre-ordered. You can choose to pre-pay weekly, monthly, or even daily before 8 am. All meals are healthy balanced meal choices and there are 2 options daily that vary throughout the year. You can cancel meals in advance from your order history. Kelly Morehouse will be one of the cafeteria staff and we are still looking for another worker. Please let us know if you are interested.

Volunteers

We love our volunteers, and we are able to have volunteers in schools this year. Welcome back! Volunteers must have an up-to-date criminal record check and Policy 701 form on file with us. There is also a package of information at the office that needs to be read and signed off on. No Child Without.

If your child has a severe allergy or medical condition, Policy 704 states that they should be wearing a medical alert bracelet. The *No Child Without* program offers a free Medic Alert membership to students who attend school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday. The Medic Alert membership.

- Gives emergency first responders immediate access to your child's medical information on their Medic Alert bracelet
- Enables first responders to quickly obtain up to date medical information by means of the child's Electronic Health Record through the 24-Hour Emergency Hotline.
- Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline
- Allows free updates of the child's medical record as needed

Medic Alert identification alerts school staff, friends, coaches, and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur. To get your medic alert bracelet visit <u>www.nochildwithout.ca</u>.

<u>Lice</u>

A reminder that lice can be passed on person to person. We ask that you check your child at home and let the school know if anything is found. Please educate your child by telling them that lice is very contagious and spread through head-to-head contact and sharing of personal items such as combs and hats. We can all work together to minimize cases at our school. Our policy is to contact home if nits or lice are found so that a parent can pick up their child and treat them. Children treated who have nits or lice can return the next day and we will check them again upon arrival.

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School Code of Conduct

All students at NES who were here last year have had lessons on Zones of Regulation. This program teaches students about self-regulation, which is also known as self-control, selfmanagement, and impulse control. The lessons are designed to help the students recognize when they are in the different zones as well as learn how to use strategies to change or stay in the zone, they are in. This will be a tool that we will use and teach to our new students again this year. We also will continue with our 7 Habits focus. These habits are our school code of conduct, and we refer to them regularly. They include be proactive, begin with the end in mind, put first things first, think win-win, seek first to understand and then to be understood, synergize, and sharpen the saw. If you have any questions or would like more information, please let us know. We also teach our students to solve problems restoratively by repairing the harm they have caused through conversations.

NES Healthy Minds

Welcome back to school! We are still accepting donations to keep our minds healthy at school. We spend our donations on topping up lunches, snack foods, playground toys to play with at outdoor recess times and to support new initiatives for new playground equipment. Covid 19

Hopefully you have had a chance to read our handbook regarding this year's protocols. Any student with Covid will be required to go home and may not return until symptoms have improved and they have been fever free for 24 hours without medication. As well, they should be excluded until 48 hours after vomiting and diarrhea without medication. Students may choose to wear a mask to school if they desire.

Cross Country Run

NES will have a cross country team for grades 3, 4, and 5 this year. Students will have an opportunity to run during PE classes as apart of our fitness unit. Students who finish in the top 5 for their grade will be able to compete against other schools at the Big Axe Cross Country Invitational. More information to be sent home in the coming days. Our hope is that parents will also encourage and support their child in their training at home as well. Grade 3 students will run 1 km, grade 4 will run 1.5 km and grade 5 will run 2 Km.

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Busses

Students are allowed 2 drop off locations unless parents live apart. This should be indicated on the student information form that went home. Students will not be permitted to be dropped off at a friend's home for sleep overs etc. Bus notes are required if a child is going to their alternate stop, and we need to know schedules for children going to two different permanent stops. If your child does not return home on time as planned, please call the school. Please allow 15 minutes after expected arrival time in the afternoons before calling the school looking for students who have not yet arrived – this allows for time delays such as: spare drivers new to a route, breakdowns that may occur on the road to get communicated, delays because of the driver dealing with behavior issues, students dawdling on the way home from the stop, etc. If a student is more than 15 minutes late getting home, then please call. And as always, we ask that parents be visible at afternoon bus stops. Drivers will not let students out if they do not see an adult at the home and they will be returned to the school for the parent to pick up. Also, students have been made aware of bus expectations as well as consequences for student misbehavior on school buses. Drivers will contact the parent regarding misbehavior and a bus suspension can be issued for serious offences. Please review bus rules with your child so their ride will run smoothly. Walkers

K-2 walkers will be taken to the sidewalk in front of the school between 1:50 pm and 2:00 pm. A parent or guardian must be present to receive them. The 3-5 walkers are dismissed between 2:40 pm and 2:50 pm to the sidewalk. The same rule applies to these students to have someone to pick them up or if they are walking home on their own and someone is at home, permission must be granted. A permission form has gone home to all walkers that is required to be filled out so we have up to date information on who will be picking your child up at dismissal or if in grade 3-5 they will be walking home on their own.

Friday Forum

This year we will have a weekly assembly on Fridays at 1pm to celebrate birthdays, leadership and to discuss kindness and bullying awareness. It will be a great time of learning together.
