Question: What do peppers do when they get angry?

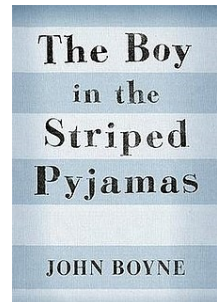
Language Arts
