

SCHOOL WINTER PLAN 2022

Healthy and Safe Schools – School Winter Plan Kindergarten to Grade 8

Effective January 10, 2022



The following is the School Winter Plan 2022 for Kindergarten to Grade 8 students and school personnel in New Brunswick public schools. Throughout the winter months, schools and school districts may move in and out of the following alert levels. If schools or communities are experiencing a high number of COVID-19 cases and an increase in transmission, Regional Public Health will work with schools and school districts to carry out a detailed risk assessment to determine if a move to stricter guidelines are required.

The risks assessment looks at a number of factors including but not limited to:

- how prevalent cases are within the greater community;
- whether the case involves a presumed variant;
- how many close contacts the individual who tested positive has had and how early the case was detected;
- the layers of protection that were in place while they were at school such as masking or assigned seating;
- the use of shared spaces between the individual who tested positive and others (lockers, hallways, buses, breakrooms, etc.); and
- the COVID-19 vaccination rate of the school or greater community.
