Summer Personification	example for winter personified	In the fall we had spent some time working with personification and personified either Fall or Winter. This time try personifying Summer. *Remember that personification is when we give non-human things human like qualities. Include the following: Describe how summer looks How summer walks or talks (do they have a bounce in their step? Do they stomp their feet? Are they sneaky? Etc.) What characteristics does summer have? (eye color, hair color, clothes etc.) How do they carry themselves. (are they confident? Shy?) Remember, your goal is to imagine that the season of summer is a person, so think of some of the things that you enjoy (or don't like) about summer and imagine what summer would be like if they were a real person and not a season. After, draw a picture of what you think summer would look like. Share your picture with a friend, family member or your teacher.
