


# Snowball!

# Snowball!

Looking for a fun way to help your class practice basic computation skills? Do you have students ready for different levels of challenge? Then “Snowball” is for you!

This game comes with 3 different editions—so you can pick the one that meets your students’ needs. Have everyone play the same version or differentiate so different groups get different games.

Here’s how they work:

Snowball 100 requires students to roll 2 dice and add the totals until they reach 100. The “twist”? If they roll doubles, they need to SUBTRACT that amount.

Snowball 200 requires students to roll 3 dice and add the totals until they reach 200. The “twist”? If they roll “3 in a row”, they have to subtract the total  
(ex. 3,4,5 or 1,2,3)

Snowball 300 requires students to roll 3 dice, add two, and multiply by the third until they reach 300. The “twist”? If they roll “3 in a row”, they have to subtract the total  
(ex. 3,4,5 or 1,2,3)

All game boards come in color to be laminated for reuse or in black and white to use as reproducibles!

Supplies: 2 dice, game board/notebook, marker

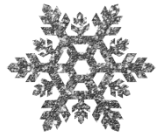
