## WELLNESS WEDNESDAY SERIES

Every Wednesday, our students will be invited to a school-wide Virtual Assembly focused on Social Emotional Learning. One of the comments in the Our School Survey this year (completed by our Grade 4 and 5 students) was that students are having difficulty getting along with each other since they are in bubbles all year. Getting along with others, relationship skills, awareness of others are lessons we are working on with students. Mr. Wood and his students did an excellent job in the first assembly demonstrating how they use sentence starters to help resolve conflict. For example, students can start a discussion with a peer with the following sentence starts to help:

When you	
It makes me feel	
Because	
I would like	

The Grade 4 students explained that when there is a conflict, students can work to identify the problem and use their words to work it out. This will be modeled for students and there are visuals to help. We look forward to helping our students work on their problem-solving skills with each other.
