The group is an advisory committee for the principal and represents the parents of the school. There are specific responsibilities and a clear mandate for the function of the committee. It is not supervisory nor does it get involved in operational matters of the school.

### Here are just a few highlights of what the PSSC accomplished in the past:

- Advocated for a new sidewalk adjacent to Ellerslie Street by meeting with the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer for the Town of Oromocto. This is a great addition to our school!
- Reviewed ways in how to best engage parents
- Welcomed a new District Education Council member to the table, representing the Town of Oromocto schools (Sub-district 13, Thomas Geburt)
- The School Improvement Plan and the Positive Learning and Working Environment Plan are on the agenda and we review progress each month.
- Helped design a parent survey last year asking about Positive learning, communication and safety.

Students arriving late for class are marked as tardy and this is documented on the report card.


