
PLEASE BE SURE YOUR CHILD IS DRESSED FOR THE WEATHER!

Nutrition Programs

We have been fortunate to obtain a few grants this year to help with our Nutrition program. This year, we received a PC Children's Charity grant that we are using to help with our Breakfast program. Students at our school can visit the kitchen between 8:00 – 8:25 to get some food to eat if they missed breakfast or are still hungry.

As well, we got a grant from the Fredericton Community Foundation to help with snacks. We are happy to be getting fresh apples for each classroom weekly. We also have snacks in the classroom for any students who are still hungry (especially later in the afternoon).

***A goal this year is for us to eliminate using single – use utensils. We no longer give out plastic spoons and forks so please ensure your child has a fork or spoon in his/her lunch. We hope to soon be using only washable dishes for our Hot Lunch program. Stay tuned for this new development.

An Important Reminder to Parents

Summerhill Street Elementary School is a closed campus during the instructional day. This means that all school doors are locked in the morning and remain locked throughout the instructional day. All visitors to the school enter through the main entrance doors by ringing the doorbell and signing in at the office. This is the standard in all schools in Anglophone West School District and is in place for the safety of children.

To avoid disruptions and maintain our safety protocols, parents and visitors are asked to not walk through the school during the instructional day. In the case of an emergency, should a parent be needed in the classroom, the parent will be asked to sign in. Otherwise, parents are asked to remain at the office and to allow for the child to come to them.

At the end of the day, parents wait outside or in a vehicle and children will be dismissed through the front doors. The foyer is too small to have parents waiting. Once again this is to minimize disruption and maintain our safety protocols.

Should parents wish to speak with their child's teacher, they are requested to make an appointment as opposed to walking in to request a conversation during the school day. Safety is our number one concern and if there is not a prearranged meeting time with the teacher, it is very difficult for the teacher to speak with a parent while supervising their class. Emails also work very well in connecting with a teacher.

If there is someone who is picking your child up who does not appear on their registration form, we will have to call you to ensure that person is allowed to pick your child up. It is wonderful if you can let us know in a note or a message the name of the person who is picking your child up (if it is someone who does not typically come for pickup).

We appreciate your assistance with this.



Seeing All That Life Has To Offer!

One of the most important

senses is our sight. Having good eyesight contributes to our overall sense of well-being and is an important factor in achieving success at work, home and school.

Tips for good eye health:

- Eat a healthy, well-balanced diet. Eating a diet rich in antioxidants and Vitamin C (like fruits, nuts and vegetables) contributes to good eye health.
- 2. Get regular eye exams. Eye examinations are recommended every two years; sooner if any vision changes are noticed or if there is an injury to the eye(s).
- **3. Limit Screen time.** Screen time is hard on the eyes. For better eye health, limit screen time to less than 2 hours per day.
- **4. Take 20.** Take a 20 second "eye break" from your computer screen by focusing on something 20 feet away every 20 minutes.
- **5. Exercise Regularly.** Exercise improves blood circulation and oxygen flow to the eyes. For good eye health, exercise at least 60 minutes a day.
- 6. Get enough sleep. Getting adequate amounts of sleep at night maintains eye health. Health Canada recommends 9-11 hour of sleep at night for children ages 5-13 and 8-10 hours of sleep for youth 14-17.
- 7. Protect your eyes. Wear protective eyewear when doing at-risk activities. Wear Sunglasses to protect eyes from the sun's harmful ultraviolet rays. When purchasing sunglasses, look for lenses that block out 99-100% of both UVA and UVB radiation.

For Parents

For some families, lack of insurance can be a barrier to obtaining an early eye exam for their children. For those who lack private insurance coverage, there is a provincial dental and vision plan for children (18 years of age and younger) of lower-income families called the "Healthy Smiles, Clear Vision" program. Eligibility for the program is based on several criteria, including a limited family net income. To apply, families can download the application form at

www.gnb.ca/socialdevelopment. For families who do not fit the financial eligibility criteria of the program and are unable to afford vision exams for their children, please contact your school's Healthy Learners in School Program nurse.
