But many of the features of an eating disorder involve more than simply eating more; it involves self-discipline, perfectionism and wanting to please others — traits that are often socially desirable in females. - Tendency towards perfectionism and selfcriticism
- Guilt, shame or secrecy associated with eating

- 5) Strict avoidance of certain foods particularly those considered 'fattening'
- 6) Feeling fat regardless of body size
- Weight and food control determining feelings about her/his worth
