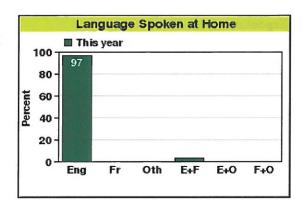

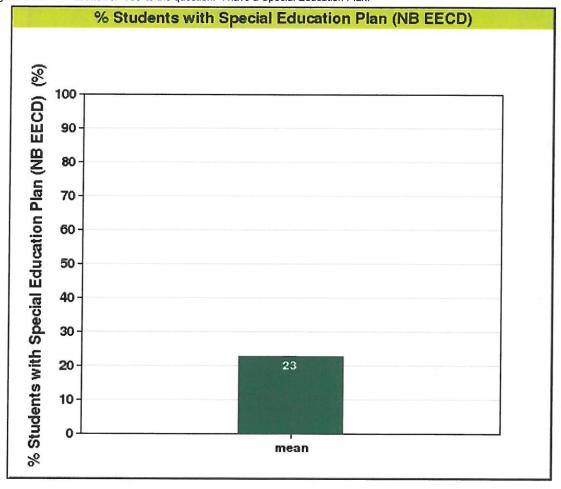

Percentage of students that answer 'Yes' to the question: "I have a Special Education Plan:"



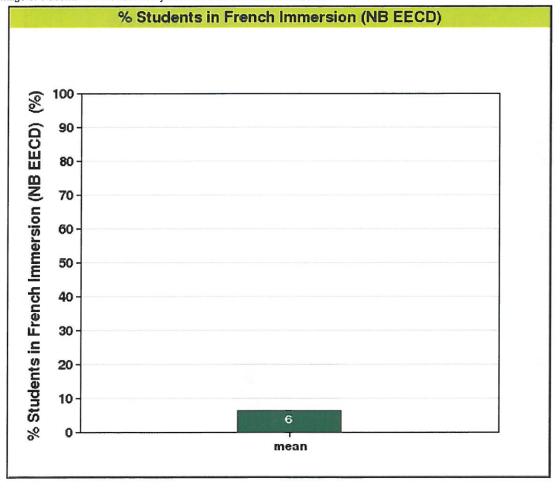

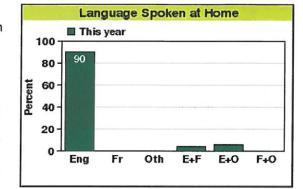

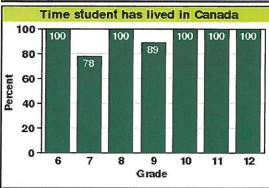

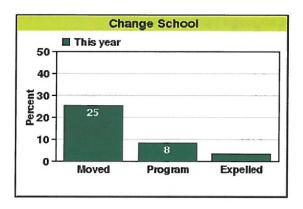

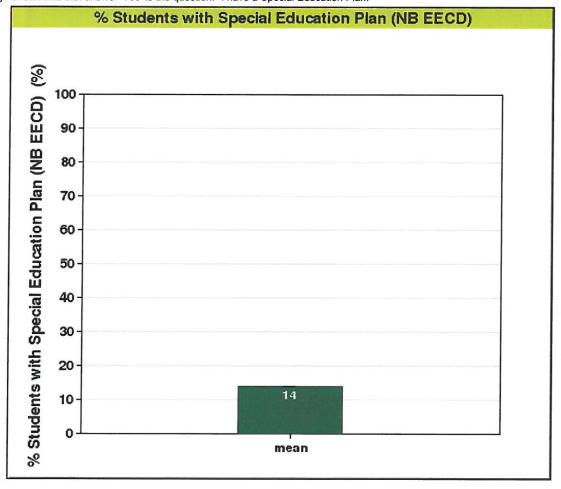

Percentage of students that answer 'Yes' to the question: "I have a Special Education Plan:"

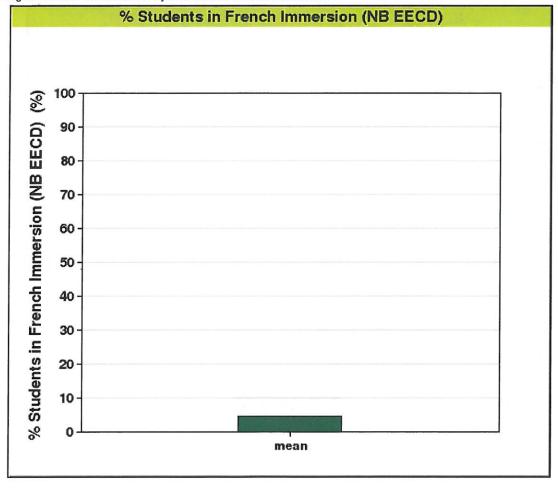

Mean score on Happiness Index (NB EECD)

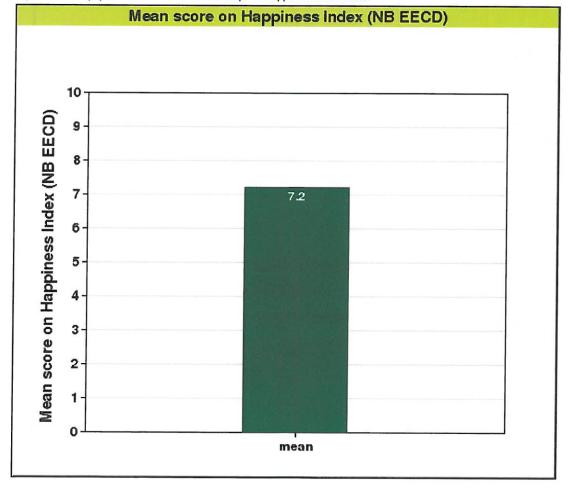

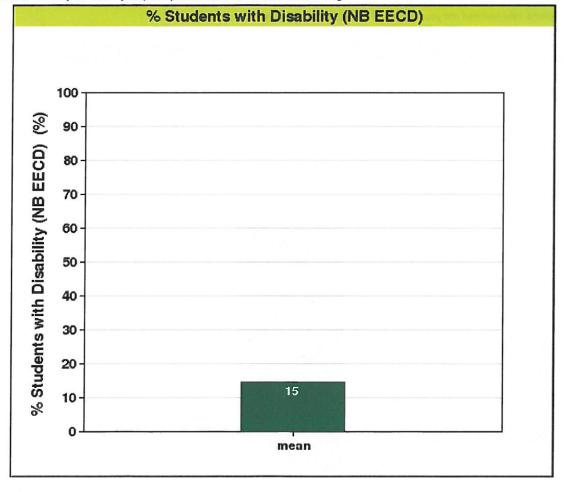
