Dear Parents/Guardians of Students at Liverpool Street School,

On May 24, 2018, the Anglophone West School District Education Council (ASD-W DEC) voted in favour of undertaking a sustainability study of Liverpool Street School, under the process outlined in the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Provincial Policy 409: Multi-year School Infrastructure Planning. This policy serves as a foundation for determining the sustainability of a school, taking into account many aspects, such as:

**Enrolment
Transportation
Economic Development**

**Health and Safety
Impact on Community
Impact on Other Schools**

**Quality Education and Services
Finances**

The Liverpool Street School had not been identified as a trigger school, but was identified on ASD-W Major Capital Projects lists as priority #4 for the consideration of a new school combined with Forest Hill Elementary School. Therefore, the DEC has decided to start the sustainability study at this time.

The sustainability study follows a process that includes three public meetings. The first public meeting will be for a presentation of facts about Liverpool Street School, in line with, but not limited to, the categories above. The second public meeting will allow for interested individuals, stakeholders and parties to present information to be considered in the decision-making process. A registration process for this meeting will be shared following the first meeting. The third public meeting will occur in **January 2019**, at a Public DEC Meeting. At this time, the DEC will discuss the study and vote on a final recommendation. That recommendation will be one of three possibilities (Section 6.4.2):

1. **Maintain the status-quo at Liverpool Street School.**
2. **Provide for repairs to Liverpool Street School.**
3. **Build a new school, closing Liverpool Street School and combine with Forest Hill Elementary School for students continued education.**

The Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development must approve recommendation #2 or #3, if made by the DEC.

The staff of Anglophone West School District will gather and organize information that will be presented at the first meeting. As mentioned above, the meeting will be open to the public. We will also inform affected persons (beyond parents) through a public notice.

A timeline will be produced and dates/times/locations for all the public meetings will be confirmed, in the near future.
