Sustainability Study – Liverpool Street Elementary School – Meeting #1

- Kimberley Douglass, District Education Chairperson, welcomed everyone to the first Sustainability Study public meeting for Liverpool Street Elementary School. Kimberley thanked the Principal of Liverpool Street Elementary School for her hospitality and a tour of the school prior to the meeting.
- Catherine Blaney, Acting Superintendent of ASD-W presented a 38 page power point presentation called Liverpool Street Elementary School Sustainability Study. This presentation along with other documents supporting this study can be found on our website http://web1.nbed.nb.ca/sites/ASD-W/sustainability/Pages/Liverpool.aspx
- The District Education Council (DEC) introduced themselves and they provided the area in which they serve as a Councilor.
- The next public meeting at Liverpool Street Elementary School will be held on <u>November 29, 2018 at 6:30 p.m.</u> At that time, stakeholders will be given an opportunity to present to the DEC. A stakeholder registration form is posted on the Anglophone West School District website under Liverpool Street Elementary Sustainability Study. This document needs to be completed and sent to Carol Clark-Caterini one week prior to that meeting to present to the Council. The final meeting will be held on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>January 24, 2019</u> at Fredericton High School, Tom Morrison Theatre.
- Three outcomes included in Policy 409 are to remain status quo (where the study is declared finished), to make a recommendation to the Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development to invest in repairs for the school, and thirdly, a recommendation to build a new school and close Liverpool Street Elementary School and combine with Forest Hill Elementary School for students continued education.

Public Comments and Questions:

- Are you looking for a location in this area that would support a new school? Kimberley answered that they would make a site recommendation to the Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development for approval. The parent asked if the district could then share the location that they would be recommending. Shawn responded that the current Liverpool Street Elementary School would be the best location as the space is large enough to support a larger school.
- Do you have projections for this catchment area? Shawn referenced reviewing the South Side Study that had been completed by Ernst & Young. Included in this study is the catchment area projections. Shawn made the audience aware of this study being available on the ASD-W website under sustainability studies, if interested in reviewing.
- Kimberley recognized the city of Fredericton to be a growing city unlike other communities in the Province of NB.

Closing Comments:

- The Acting Superintendent reminded the community to be prepared for the next public meeting on <u>November 29, 2018</u> by completing the stakeholder registration form available at the entrance of the school or on the ASD-W Liverpool Street Elementary School Sustainability Study website. Once completed, this document needs to be submitted to <u>carol.clark-caterini@gnb.ca</u> one week in advance of the meeting with details of who will be presenting to the District Education Council.
- The Superintendent's power point presentation was posted to the Liverpool Street Elementary School Sustainability Study website with other pertinent documents for review.
